A note from the Pastor - December 2, 2022



"The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus" Isaiah 35:1

This week, my Christmas cactus in my office offered a single floral bloom. The cactus is getting a head start on getting ready for Christmas. That is what we have been planning to do all Advent. Now that we are into Advent, how are we at getting prepared?



Getting ready and saying yes means not waiting until it is here. We do not know the hour or the day; we are reminded. However, the prophet Isaiah reminds us that the coming of the Lord will cause creation and nature to rejoice!

Do you remember your parents calling you and asking if you were ready for school or church? Or maybe you called your siblings or your children. You would hear up the stairs or from the other side of the wall, "RED-DEY??" More than once, in my family, people would be running at the last moment and getting prepared until the car was almost leaving without them. Or perhaps, they had been distracted by something else, and getting ready had yet to happen because of something else that caught their attention.

As we get ready for Christmas, the coming of Jesus, let us prepare now. The Advent practices of our Say Yes devotional and other spiritual practices seek to get us in the habit of living ready. Do not wait for the voice to cry out, "RED-DEY??" Start today preparing for Christ's coming. Like the blooming of my Christmas cactus, you will know you are on the way when you break out in rejoicing.

Joining you in preparation this Advent season by saying YES to hope, kindness, bravery, daring, love, joy, curiosity, and generosity.

New Appointment Announcement and EPA/GNJ Affiliation Update

See, I am doing a new thing, can't you see it. -Isaiah prophesied

Dear United Methodists of EPA and GNJ,

We are living in a challenging season as we emerge from the pandemic, disaffiliation and the continuing movement of secular culture away from religion and the church. But every time, in the midst of challenge, God has been ready to do a new thing. For a tormented people enslaved in Egypt, or a wandering people on a dusty trail in the wilderness, or three young people in a fiery furnace standing up to a king, or a huddled group of disciples in an upper room, God was working a new thing.

Can't you see it? God's new thing is springing up all around us even today. (Isaiah 43:19 and 65:16-17).

At the most recent Northeastern Jurisdictional Conference (NEJ) where we elect new bishops, the conference could have elected four bishops but chose to elect only one, in part because of membership and financial realities. It is becoming clearer that alignments and affiliations between conferences will be the future model within the NEJ, and that EPA and GNJ will be working together into the future.




the memorial garden. The plaque marking the location reads:




Did you catch us in the news? In the last two weeks, we have been in the news twice! We are sharing the good news of how we are making a difference in our community. Take a look at the two videos above!

Over the course of the weekend, they were on target to pack 50,000 meals. These meals benefit children and families. We were shown a video of the mud cookies that families eat when no food is



available. It was heartbreaking. Thank you for making a difference in the lives of our siblings in Christ.

We already contributed all of the donations that you offered. There was no requirement to pay for all of the meals you packed; as a result, East Stroudsburg UMC, who hosted us, has not yet made up the difference in the cost. They are down \$5000. 
Angel Tree
