

Sample Order of Service

Prelude

Our pianist/organist will generally prepare music for before and after the service (Gathering/Processional and Postlude/Recessional).

Word of Grace and Prayer

The pastor will generally lead the times of prayer unless a member of the family or a friend would like to participate in the service in this way.

Hymn or Special Music

Hymns sung by the congregation are always appropriate. Our church musicians will usually play for all memorial services. Other instrumental music and/or special vocal music may be included. The pastor can work with the family to choose appropriate music.

Scriptures

The pastor will work with the family to choose scriptures to be read.

Message

The message is a short meditation on scripture intended to comfort and provide hope in eternal life through reflection on the text as well.

Witness

At this time we remember the life of your loved one. This can be done in various ways including having people speak, having the pastor(s) read letters or remembrances written by family and friends, or with the pastor remembering the life of the deceased.

Hymn

Prayer

With this prayer we “commend” your loved one into the loving arms of God praying that God receive and him or her into peace of everlasting life.

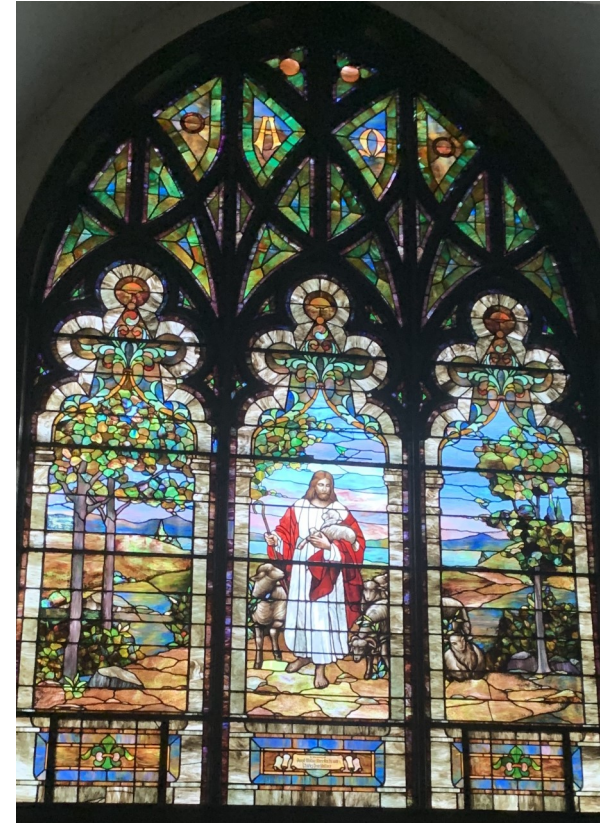
Benediction

Postlude

This order can be shortened, lengthened or changed in order to create a service to remember and celebrate the life of your loved one.

A Place to begin

Prior to death: Our pastors consider it a sacred privilege to visit and pray with you during this difficult time. If time and circumstances allow, please call the church office (570-421-6020) to notify us . One of our pastors will make every effort to come and pray with you and your family.

When death occurs: When your loved one dies, please call the church office (570-421-6020). If possible, one of our pastors can be with you. If you are calling after business hours, you may choose Pastor Monica's mailbox and get her cell phone number.

Setting the date and time for the service: Our pastors wish to help you plan a meaningful service to celebrate the life of your loved one. One of our pastors will coordinate the service, please contact prior to scheduling the service date and time. The pastor will review the availability of our facilities and calendar to set a time that is convenient for everyone.

Planning the service: The pastor will want to meet with the family members at mutually convenient location to coordinate the service. This is a time to share stories and favorite memories of your loved one. Family members will find this to be a very helpful time as well as a source of comfort. Your loved one may have left instructions about the service, please share these instructions with the pastor at this time. In the back of this resource, you will find a list of hymns and scripture that will be a helpful resource to you prior to meeting with the pastor.

Working with Funeral Homes: If you are working with a funeral home, please have the Funeral Director coordinate with the pastor for set-up, internment, and support. If the funeral home will not be present at the service, please advise the pastor so that we might plan for church greeters and support.

Internments: Our pastors are privileged to walk with your family at all parts of the service. If you are intending to intern your loved one at a time other than the funeral or memorial service, please coordinate with the pastors to plan a mutually agreeable time.

Expenses

There are no building usage fees for services held at Stroudsburg UMC.

Musicians: There is a suggested honorarium of \$150 each for our choir director and musician. If a vocalist or instrumentalist is desired there will be an additional honorarium of \$100 is suggested for this person or persons.

Custodial care: Our custodian cares for the building before and after the services and is renumerated at \$100.

Clergy: While pastoral services including the memorial service are offered free of charge to members of the church and to the community, many people still ask what a recommended honorarium would be. We recommend an honorarium of \$150 – 300 for the pastor. These honorariums are due on the day of the service and should be made payable to the individual.

Flowers & Memorial Gifts: The family may wish to provide flowers for the altar. Delivery should be at least one hour prior to the service. In lieu of flowers, families may wish to offer donations to the church in memory of their loved one. We recommend donations to our Endowment Fund to continue the vital ministries that support you and your loved ones.

Bulletins: A suggested donation for the cost and preparation of the bulletin is \$10 for 50 bulletins and \$20 for 100 bulletins.

Funeral Luncheon

The church can arrange to have a luncheon provided at your request. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited.
