A note from the Pastor - December 12, 2025

"This is what the Lord has done for me in this time, when he looked favorably on me and took away the disgrace I have endured among my people." Luke 1:25

During this season of merry and bright, there are many for whom this is a challenging season. While Hallmark shows images of happy families and immaculately decorated homes, many people feel the darkness and discouragement, pain and sorrow. Social isolation is a significant problem in our culture. Loneliness compounds other issues. Consider in your own life how grief is often most pointed at holidays. We miss our loved ones at times when we would have expected or wanted to see them.



The verse above comes from the first chapter of Luke in the story of the birth of Jesus. Long before we get to the nativity scene with shepherds and a donkey, Elisabeth and Zechariah discover that they will be parents after decades of waiting to have a child. Elisabeth is Mary's older cousin, who, in the first chapter, receives an unexpected announcement of her own: the coming of a child. After Zechariah hears that he will be a father, he has so many questions that he is struck mute. He cannot speak and Elisabeth is in the months of pregnancy by herself. It is an incredible kindness and providence that brings Mary to visit Elisabeth. Their connection brings them support and joy. That connection brings them hope and demonstrates God's compassion. "Compassion requires us to constitute a radical form of criticism, for it announces that the hurt is to be taken seriously, that the hurt is not to be accepted as normal and natural but is an abnormal and unacceptable condition." (Walter Bruggemann: The Prophetic Imagination, 88)

In light of our experiences of bleakness and darkness, sadness and blue, I invite you to consider reaching out to someone in your life who needs compassion. Someone who is missing a loved one or knows extra pain in the cold of winter. Give a call to someone alone at mealtimes or text someone who is trying to balance all the challenges of life, by themselves. If you find yourself as an Elisabeth, there are plenty of Marys around whose lives would be made strong by your presence. If you find yourself as a Mary, visit an Elisabeth to bring cheer and experience joy!

On this upcoming JOY Sunday, consider wearing pink to celebrate the presence of God in the surprises of this Advent season.



Paint the Town Red is a wonderful collaboration between some of the downtown churches to both beautify our town and raise funds for the food ministries.
